Market Harborough Street Pastors have been in operation for over 10 years, are all volunteers from local churches and are managed by a local board. A hard working administrator sorts out the rotas, reports, and returns that need to be sent to head office. They are usually on patrol from 7.30 pm on alternate Friday nights, visiting Welland Park and The Cube Youth Club at Symington's Rec before their break and the town centre from 10 pm. On alternate Saturday nights they patrol from 10 pm to 2 am (or later) mainly in the town centre. They also patrol on Bank Holiday Sundays (Easter Sunday, both May Bank Holidays and the late August Bank Holiday) from 10 pm.

They help in various ways: flip-flops for sore feet, a small amount of first aid, and water to help the unwell. They help with finding lost keys, charging mobiles and offering aid when people vomit. Many people suffer from too much alcohol which is not their fault. They often lend a listening ear to people who just need to talk and if possible they suggest where they might get further advice. They are not paid, and flip flops, training and uniforms are expensive, so we are pleased to be supporting them tonight.
