JOHN CASS (J5x32)

- **1-4** 1s lead down the middle, 2s+3s step up on 3-4
- 5-8 1s lead up to 3rd place, turn RH finishing in tandem, facing 3M, Man leading
- **9-16** 2M+3M, 1s & 4L+5L, all in tandem, dance a diagonal, all alternating, RSh reel of 3, 1s finishing facing 4M, Man leading
- 17-24 2L+3L, 1s & 4M+5M, all in tandem, dance a diagonal, all alternating, LSh reel of 3, 1s finishing in centre (3rd place own side) facing down NHJ
- 25-28 1s dance down through 4s & cast out around 5s as 4s+5s step up
- 29-32 1s pivot turn (birl) to finish in 5th place

TAMBOURINE (R8x32)

- **1-8** 1s lead down the middle & back to 2nd place own side
- 9-16 1s dance ½ reels of 3 across (Lady with 2s & Man with 3s) & ½ reels of 3 on opposite sides
- 17-24 1s dance ½ reels of 3 across (Man up Lady down) & ½ reels on own sides
- **25-32** 2s+1s+3s circle 6H round & back

Plaidurday

Plaid itself has a long history in the making. It is believed to have originally been made during the Celtic areas during the 8th - 6th century BC, and since then, archaeologists have discovered the use of plaid in places such as Austria, China, and Scandinavia. By the late 16th century, there were numerous references to plaid in paintings and in cultural fashion. From there, plaid has become a stable fashion item in countries all over the world. The 1800's had a particular fashion craze for plaid as it resembled a connection to Scottish royalty, which is why Scotland is highly associated with plaid as a concept. As a matter of fact, one random fact about the use of plaid includes that the first colour photo ever to be taken was of a plaid ribbon back in 1861.

Plaidurday began in Lansing, Michigan when Bugsy Sailor was heckled by his co-workers who made fun of him for wearing plaid. This persistent heckling led to Bugsy deciding, in August 2010, to create a holiday as a way to bring people together in their love of plaid. The first celebration took place on October 7, 2011, and since then the first Friday of October became the date to celebrate plaid.

THE LOCHALSH REEL (R8x40)

- 1-8 1s turn RH, cast 1 place, cross LH, cast 1 place to meet partner in prom hold facing 3M (Lady on Mans left)
- **9-16** 1s dance LSh reel of 3 across with 3s
- 17-24 1s split to dance reels of 3 on opposite sides
- 25-32 1s dance (nearer hands joined) to top, turn 2s with other hand, cross down between 3s & cast up to 2nd place own sides
- 1s dance RH across (Lady with 2s & Man with 3s), pass RSh to dance LH across with other couple

- **9-16** All Interlocking reels of 4, finishing ½ turn RH into ...
- **17-24** Double Men's Chain
- **25-28** All Set & Petronella in Tandem
- 29-32 All set to partner & turn 2H

THE BEES OF MAGGIEKNOCKATER (J4x32)

John Drewry (1975) Canadian Book

- 1-8 1s cross RH, cast 1 place & dance RH across with 3s & end 1M+3L **also** 1L+3M in prom hold facing out to pass corner person RSh
- 9-24 All dance 4x½ Reels of 3 on sides (to right to start, then left, right & left) with 1s+3s changing partners in centre at end of each ½ Reel to progress Men clockwise & Ladies anticlockwise. End in centre 1s facing down & 3s facing up
- 25-32 1s dance between 3s turning 3s with nearer hand 1½ times & crossing over to own sides & turn 4th person on own sides (men RH & Ladies LH)

SANDY'S SCOTCH BROTH (M-(S3x32)+(R3x32))

Gail Sibley

- **1-8** All circle 6H round & back
- **9-16** 1s dance down middle & set, dance up & cast to 2nd place
- 17-24 1s dance Corners Pass+Turn, passing RSh throughout to end 2nd place own sides facing out
- 25-32 2s+1s+3s dance Promenade (Chaperoned) Chain progression to end 3 1 2

THE ELEPHANT'S STAMPEDE (J4x48) Sq.Set

Lorna MacDonald+Gillian Mackintosh Aurora 10th Anniversary Book

- **1-8** All circle 8H round & back
- 9-16 1s+3s advance & with free hand join with 2s & 4s & retire into longwise set across the dance, all dance ½ parallel reels of 4 across
- All dance ½ R&L at each end of set, turn (person on Man's left) RH 1½ times to form square set
- 25-32 All Ladies petronella turn to next Ladies place to right & set, repeat to meet partner (all have progressed 1 place to right)
- 33-48 All dance full Schiehallion Reel

THE RUTLAND REEL (R8x40)

Robert Senior TSC Dance Book 1 & RSCDS Book 48

- 1-8 1s set, cast down one place (2s step up), 1s cross below 3s & cast up to 2nd place (on opposite sides)
- **9-16** 2s+1s dance Ladies' Chain, ending with 1s facing down
- 2s+1s+3s dance reels of 3 on sides (1s giving RSh to 3s) in 6 bars, 1s+3s ½ turn RH and end with 1M & 3M facing in 2 3 (1)
- 25-32 3s+1s dance Men's Chain, ending with 1L facing out with 1M ready to follow her
- 33-36 1L casts up and crosses to own side **whilst** 1M, following, crosses and casts up
- **37-40** 1s+3s circle to left
